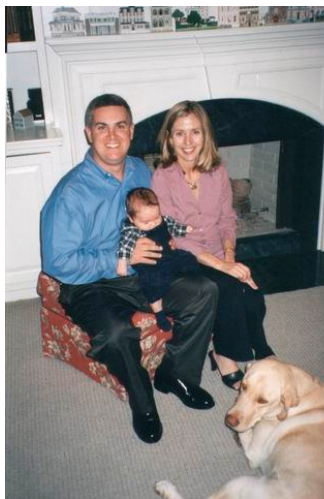


Dear Family And Friends,

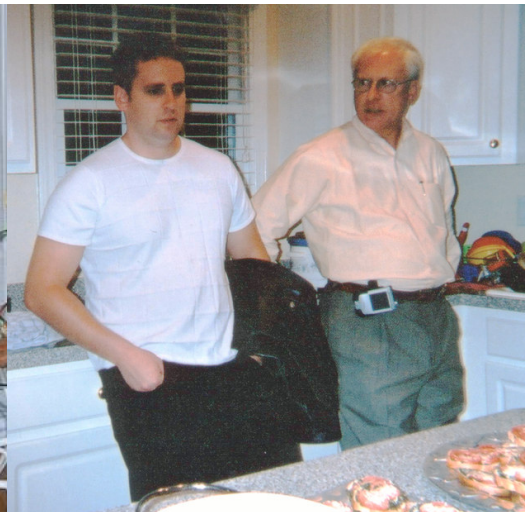
